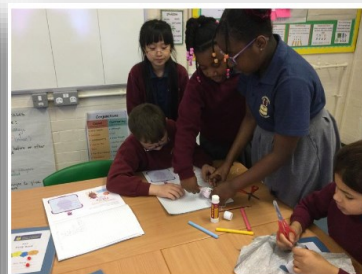
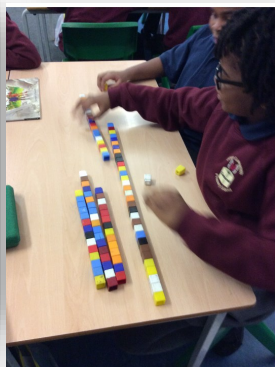
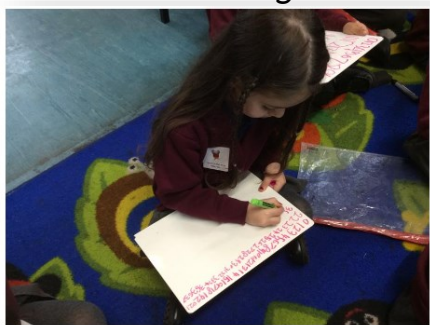
Please remember to read with your child and sign their reading record each week.

In year 1 the children have been using art as a medium to create story scenes linked to their core text Hansel and Gretel.

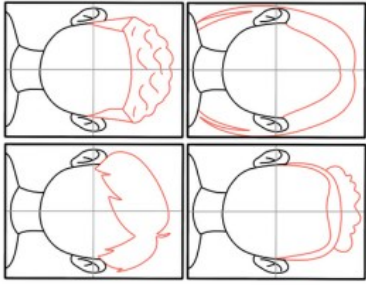

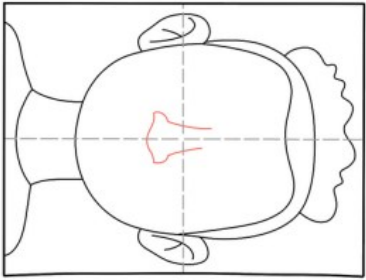

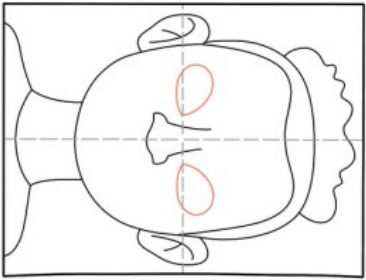
A step-by-step guide to drawing your self-portrait:



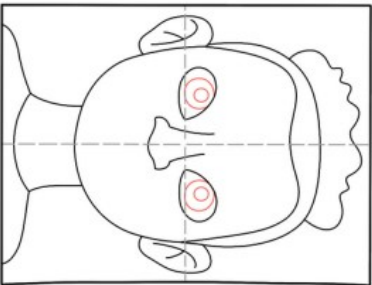
1. Draw your hair



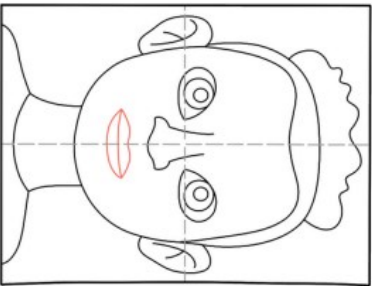
2. Add your nose in the centre of the page. (Use the lines to help guide you.)



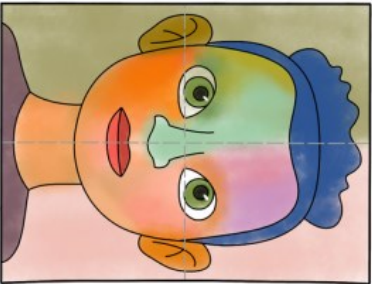
3. Draw your eyes.
